Job Responsibilities

- 1. Perform assigned projects.
- 2. Study and become familiarized with elastomer technology, rubber compounding ingredients, and mixing/testing equipment.
- Learn how various ingredients affect critical compound properties (hardness, strength properties, traction properties, etc.) by performing laboratory experiments and thoroughly analyzing the data.
- 4. Attend races and tire tests to experience "hands-on" performance of race compounds.
- After acclimating, design and lead your own project related to compound performance, compound processing, thermodynamics of tire curing, etc.
- 6. Regular written reports (e-mails) for project updates.
